The Waldorf School of Baltimore is a Pre K–8th school seeking a Waldorf trained, lead Early Childhood teacher to join our Children’s Garden for the 2016-17 school year. We are looking for a qualified and motivated individual with a love for teaching and children, who wishes to work through a dedication to Waldorf pedagogy. The right candidate would also possess an ability to collaborate with colleagues and parents and rise to the challenges facing a school in a highly competitive local educational environment.

Our Children’s Garden currently consists of four classes. Two are Kindergartens and two are five day Nurseries. We also offer Parent and Child classes, and a Forest Aftercare program. We added our second Kindergarten this year, and we look forward to further developing our birth to three and our forest programs in the near future.

Founded in 1971, we have been a full member of AWSNA since 1985. Our beautiful campus in northern Baltimore City is situated on a wooded hillside adjacent to Cylburn Arboretum. We are a certified Maryland Green School, and we are dedicated to sustainability and continuing to develop our outdoor education programs from pre-k through grade 8. The school reflects the diverse nature of its community, drawing students from urban, suburban and rural areas. We are housed in our own beautiful purpose-built building overlooking the city. We are fortunate to have a beautiful new Children’s Garden facility and a large outdoor space where the children run and play, walk in the woods, and work in our school garden.
